The CLEAR Network

For those unfamiliar with the above photo, the CLEAR system is a database provided by the Chicago Police Department. It covers all of Cook County and can be accessed by those whose agencies request it. CLEAR has several options but the areas that affect those who work with juveniles will be arrests and field interview reports.

CLEAR will not only list those arrested, but can include a brief narrative of the incident subsequent to arrest as well. CLEAR also will have mug shots of those arrested including photos of tattoos. Field Interview reports are documented encounters that CPD will have with subjects in their jurisdiction. By documenting where/when our juveniles are observed, law enforcement agencies could determine possible crime trends or contacts their target might have outside town.
